Congratulations! To Nathan and Adele Shoesmith on the arrival of their daughter Charlotte, born on the 24th October. Congratulations also to Kate and Greg Shoesmith on becoming grandparents and to Elaine Michaelides on becoming a great-great-grandmother.

A date in our history: Next Wednesday 13th November, it will be **120 years** since our church was opened by Lady Janet Clarke with a golden key, on Sunday 13th November 1904. The Dedication Service on this day was conducted by the Rev. Professor J. L. Rentoul.

A note about the key: Many years later, this key 'went missing'. The Regional News Gazette on the 14th September 1972, states: "Recently it was realised that a large gold plated key embellished and studded with imitation jewels was missing from its customary place attached to a plaque on the wall. It is of significant historical attachment for it was used in the ceremony when the late Lady Janet Clarke, widow of the late Sir William Clarke, turned the lock in the church door when the building was officially opened on Sunday November 13, 1904." An appeal was made for information on the whereabouts of the key but it was never found. A replica was later created which we now still have in our possession.

Sammy Stamp news from October Network magazine: A couple of Sammy's helpers recently journeyed to Kangaroo Flat UC (Bendigo) to speak at a UCAF Regional gathering. Their presentation included how a lot of our sales are accomplished through the internet, including buyers from overseas. The Sammy Stamp CD (now 8 years old) was also shown. Sammy Stamp volunteers really enjoyed the day – and the food – and came home with many stamps to trim, sort and sell. Up to and including the 5th September, sales had reached about \$22,330 (\$22,542 same period last year). We have not approved any further grants, therefore the total amount in grants approved so far this year remains at \$39,900.

- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
