Recycling updates

1. Hume Clean Days The next one is 8am-4pm on Saturday 7th September. You can take the following items to the Sunbury Resource Recovery Centre (515 Riddell Road) free of charge:

- mattresses and couches
- tyres
- whitegoods (fridges, washing machines, dryers etc.)
- e-waste (TVs, computers, printers, DVDs, CDs, speakers, sound equipment, DVD players, video recorders, mobile phones, appliances)

2. Hume City Council is making it easier for residents to get rid of their hard waste and other items that can't go in household bins. Tip passes are now being phased out and replaced with flexible waste vouchers that can be used for 3 different services. Instead of 2 tip passes and 2 hard waste collections each year, you will have 5 waste vouchers that can be used to drop off waste at a Resource Recovery Centre (above), book a hard waste collection or use their new service, the bundled branch (tree) collections. All you need is proof of address, such as drivers licence or utility bill. (This information was in the recycling pack that came with your new 'green' bin if you received one, or search the Hume website under 'new waste vouchers'.)

3. Did you know? (I didn't!) I've just learned from an RACV email that discarded electric blankets are considered e-waste and can be taken to any facility that collects this type of recycling. I've verified this on the phone with the RRC above who said "anything with a power cord is e-waste"!



Use the recycling trolley in the foyer for the following:

- old biros and textas
- medication blisters



- milk bottle tops
- bread bag tags <u>plastic</u> only
 (<u>NO</u> tea bag tags, ring pulls please)
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (not plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa



Use the big plastic container for:

10c containers such as:



- see flyers on the recycling trolley.

The other side of the story is to <u>BUY</u> recycled:

The other side of recycling is to try to buy products made from recycled materials, in order to create a relevant market. Without a market, the recycled material has to go to landfill.
