Latest Scamwatch warning Criminals are calling people pretending to be from your bank, internet or phone company. They will say your bank account or computer isn't secure and your money isn't safe, ask for your PIN and tell you to leave your bank card in your letterbox so it can be cancelled and replaced. They may ask you to withdraw cash and leave that in the letterbox instead, or want to pick it up from you directly. <u>HANG UP</u>! If still in doubt, visit or call the relevant company yourself. Remember, your bank or phone company will <u>never</u> ask you to: ⇒ disclose your PIN ⇒ leave your card out to be collected ⇒ withdraw cash from your account ⇒ transfer money to another account. Use the recycling trolley or boxes in photocopy room for:

- old biros and textas
- medication blisters



- milk bottle lids
 x-ray transparencie

- bread bag tags <u>plastic</u> only (no tea bag tags *or* ring pulls please)
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (<u>and</u> plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
