Thursday 27th February at 7.30pm. The theme by the Cook Islands is 'I Made You Wonderful' (Psalm 139:14) which invites us to recognise that God created each one of us with great attention and loving care. God knows us intimately, and we are special to God in our uniqueness. When we open the doors of our hearts to this truth, everything in our life changes. We glow from within, and we begin treating others as beloved children of God.

Hume Clean Days The next one is 8am-4pm next **Saturday 1st March**. You can take the following items to the Sunbury Resource Recovery Centre (515 Riddell Road) free of charge:

- mattresses and couches, tyres
- whitegoods (fridges, washing machines, dryers etc.)
- e-waste (TVs, computers, printers, DVDs, CDs, speakers, sound equipment, DVD players, VCRs, mobile phones, appliances, electric blankets).

Use the recycling trolley or boxes in photocopy room for:

- medication blisters
- x-ray transparencies
- milk bottle lids
- used biros, textas, highlighters, correction tape dispensers
- bread bag tags <u>plastic</u> only (no tea bag tags *or* ring pulls please)
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (<u>and</u> plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to new 7-Eleven on Sunbury Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa



Use the big container for:
