 - or do your own thing in Woodend's interesting little shops


The cost of tastings is usually refunded if you buy from the shop. \$69 in cash can be given to Nancy Prewer or Jackie Cowan, or you can pay by direct deposit to St. Andrew's Fundraising Account BSB 633 000, Account number 115212300. If 22 people book, the cost will be about \$59 and the difference will be refunded (see update on page 1).

• Workshop with Rev. Dr. Sally Douglas ... UCA minister/theologian and academic, based on her book The Church as Salt . What would a church look like if it sought to be salt as Jesus spoke about in Matthew 5, rather than enticed by the need to be successful? Use the recycling trolley in the foyer for the following:

- old biros and textas
- medication blisters
- milk bottle tops



- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (not plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
