Quiet Day report On a perfect 'Retreat Day', 14 diverse women from multiple denominational backgrounds and expressions of faith, gathered at Dromkeen in Riddells Creek. We began the day by considering the implications of Proverbs 4:23 "Above all else guard your heart for everything you do flows from it". We acknowledged how hard it can be to truly hear the gentle movement of the Spirit, the whisper of our loving God drawing us, over the clamour of a mind often influenced by the culture we live in.

We then spent time in personal reflection, exploring theologian Howard Thurman's quote "Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive", inviting us to consider what our own heart was drawn to – 'What makes my heart come alive?' Following a shared lunch we were invited to turn off our 'cognitive' brains and tap into our creative thinking and our heart-space, as we considered our individual life journeys and the influences on choices we have made. In spite of what we often see as weakness or failure, our hearts, the container of the presence of Love continues to draw us on. We then spent time in personal reflection with three questions:

* Who have I been? * Who am I now? * Who am I becoming?

An invitation to share, in small discussion groups then drew the day to a close.

The takeaway? Thurman's quote and the importance of listening to our heart-space and a Henri Nouwen quote: "You don't think your way into a new way of living. You live your way into a new way of thinking"

- Chaplains in Sunbury schools It has been heartening to note over the years that Sunbury schools are now initiating the employment of a Chaplain without any encouragement from Korus Connect or the Sunbury Support Group (which now consists of Helen Hall and Nancy Prewer). The latest school to request a Chaplain is Killara Primary School. The position is for 1½ days per week. Chaplaincy in Sunbury began in 1997 with a small group of women raising money to qualify for one Chaplain. The first Chaplain commenced in 2006, dividing his time between the two Secondary Colleges. The five schools currently with a Chaplain are: Sunbury Downs College, and Primary Schools – Sunbury West, Kismet Park, Sunbury Heights and soon Killara.
