Shrove (Pancake) Tuesday & Ash Wednesday

Shrove Tuesday is a day of celebration as well as penitence, because it's the last day before Lent. It is the last chance to indulge, to use up the foods that aren't allowed in Lent. In the old days there were many foods that observant Christians would not eat during Lent, such as meat and fish, fats, eggs, and milky foods. So no food was wasted, families would have a feast on shriving Tuesday (shrive = absolve) and eat up all the foods that wouldn't last the 40 days of Lent. The need to eat up the fats gave rise to the French name *Mardi Gras*, meaning *fat Tuesday*. Pancakes became associated with Shrove Tuesday because they were a dish that could use up all the eggs, fats and milk in the house with just the addition of flour.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting, and is the first day of Lent in Western Christianity. It occurs 46 days before Easter (40 fasting days – the six Sundays, which are not days of fast, are excluded). Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of blessing ashes made from palm branches blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday, and placing them on the heads of participants

Ash Wednesday is not specifically mentioned in the Bible. However, from Biblical times, sprinkling oneself with ashes has been a mark of sorrow for sin. Several times the Bible mentions people repenting in dust and ashes; for example: Mordecai (Esther 4:1), Job (Job 42:6), the inhabitants of Nineveh (Jonah 3:5-6), and Daniel (Daniel 9:3-4). Repentance in dust and ashes often was accompanied with fasting during Bible times.

- Hume Clean Days are available to help you recycle the following items (in addition to your yearly at-home hard waste collections and tip passes). The next Clean Day is Saturday 4th March at the Sunbury Landfill and Resource Recovery Centre (515 Riddell Road):
 - Mattresses
 - Couches
 - Tyres
 - Whitegoods (including fridges, washing machines and dryers)
 - E-waste (including TVs, computers, printers, DVDs, CDs, speakers, sound equipment, DVD players, video recorders, mobile phones, household appliances)
 - Any other furniture or waste will attract standard fees and charges.



Use the recycling trolley in the foyer for donations of the following:

- milk bottle tops
- bread bag tags
- tea bag tags
- old biros
- medication blisters (empty)
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs
- coffee and Slurpee etc. drink cups, plastic straws and lids
