Christmas Bowl - Share God's love this Christmas

When Victorian Methodist Minister, Rev. Frank Byatt, sat down to his



Christmas dinner 75 years ago in 1949, he knew millions of people were starving in war-ravaged Europe. He was compelled to offer help. He put a Bowl of Remembrance on his Christmas dinner table and asked his loved ones to place a gift in it to "share your good dinner with hungry children in other lands."

Frank couldn't have foreseen how his simple act of compassion that evening would grow into the powerful Christmas Bowl tradition that we now know is celebrated in thousands of churches across Australia. And he couldn't have known how much it would be needed in our world today. As you celebrate Christmas with loved ones this year, remember our sisters and brothers who have been forced from their homes by conflict or disaster.

Jesu in Sri Lanka Following large-scale violence in Sri Lanka in 1983 and a subsequent civil war, over 100,000 Tamils were forced to seek safety in India. The war ended 15 years ago, but many refugees remain spread across more than 100 camps. For refugees, safety concerns, no documentation, earning a livelihood, securing a place to live and accessing education continue to pose significant barriers to their return. After living in a refugee camp in India for 13 years, Jesu and his family returned to their homeland, only to find their home had been completely destroyed during the war. Undeterred, Jesu built a small,





thatched hut on his land to shelter his family. Through persistent advocacy by Jesu and Act for Peace's local partner for over 35 years, he was able to secure a permanent house under the government's housing scheme. Today, he has successfully built this house and has found work
