Quiet Day reflections Our focus on our last Quiet Day on the 14th September, apart from the wombat (featured on our flyer), was about being awake to the presence of God in all things. We started with "What is the purpose of wombats in this world of ours?" To answer that — they are actually incredible eco warriors — ask me later if you are wondering 'how'.



Practicing meditation or contemplation is simply being present to God. It takes us out of our head and into our heart. My experience with practicing contemplation is that it enables us to wake up to the world around us, to our place in it, and to the sacredness that is in all things and all people (including ourselves), being awake to God's presence now, here, and in whatever I am doing in this moment. Part of our day was spent confirming that everything is sacred, including the eco warrior wombats.

Emergency management petition Many of you will know that Judy Unwin's family suffered a tragedy 6½ years ago when her son Boyd's daughter Katie was brutally murdered by her partner. Boyd's family was notified in May that Katie's killer had received a reduction of 427 days off his sentence, just for being locked up in prison during covid. Many people are unaware that this legislation exists, it is from the 1990s, intended for emergencies and industrial disputes in prisons. As covid was considered an emergency by the state, all prisoners in Victoria were entitled to up to 4 days off their sentences for every day or part day they were inconvenienced. Over 1000 years has been taken off prison sentences over the covid period in Victoria.

Boyd, along with his daughter Bianca, have a parliamentary petition running to have this legislation revoked and debated in parliament as they feel it is utterly ridiculous, and once again has a huge impact on victims and their families. They are asking for your support by signing this petition.

Petition forms will be available to sign after the Service each Sunday.

Bereavement and note from the Editor: Regrettably, even though I knew of her illness, I heard only very recently about the passing of Lorraine McLaren's sister, Lyn Holman. I asked Lorraine for some details:

"On Monday 5th August my sister Lyn was 'Promoted to Glory' (as the Salvation Army calls it). Lyn was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease in 2020 and moved from Brisbane to Adelaide in Dec 2021 to be near our brother Dean (a pharmacist) and his wife Wendy (a nurse). She bought a beautiful unit in Brighton Dunes, overlooking Brighton Beach. Gradually her MND deteriorated and she needed more assistance to lead her life. For the last year of her life she was unable to walk or move without help. She had wonderful carers who looked after her, along with Dean and Wendy. Despite all the challenges, she remained positive and grateful to God for her life with all its blessings.

Lyn's funeral was held in Adelaide on 22nd August (Ivan Butler Funerals). It was a typical Salvation Army Service with a band playing the hymns, good singing and loving tributes." Please pray for Lorraine and her family.
