- United before 'Uniting' Did you know? ... our Sunbury Presbyterian and Methodist churches had strong ties over the years. The two congregations permanently became one in 1955 - 22 years before the 'Uniting Church in Australia' came into being. (The Methodist Church has not been used since then.)
- PWMU CookBook ... very last call, I'm about to order! The PWMU Cookbook is the oldest continuous cookbook in Australia, and has been in print since 1904. The 2024 edition celebrates 120 years of the book, with royalties funding the mission and

ministry of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria and the Uniting Church in Victoria. Postage is cheaper if 2 or more are ordered, so let me know this week if you'd like one and I will order in bulk. I have 10 copies ordered so far. (Helen H.)

Workshop with Rev. Dr. Sally Douglas ... UCA minister/theologian and academic, based on her book The Church as Salt. ## Use the recycling trolley in the foyer for the following:

- old biros and textas
- medication blisters



- milk bottle tops
- bread bag tags plastic only (NO tea bag tags, ring pulls please)
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (not plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids - or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
