The Congregational Annual General Meeting will be held on **Sunday 10**th **December** after the Service to elect Church Council office bearers and councillors whose terms are expiring. The office bearers for election are Congregational Chair, Congregational Secretary, Congregational Presbytery Representative and three Church Council members. These current positions will be declared vacant at the meeting and an election will be held amongst those who are nominated. Nominations must be submitted in writing to Amanda Woods or an office bearer by the 3rd December, and permission of the nominee must be obtained before the name is submitted. If no nominations are received, the positions will not be filled.

Also to be discussed at this meeting is the number of people who should be on Church Council. The suggestion is that we should reduce the number of representatives, and after discussion a motion will be drafted to reflect the wishes of the congregation. The reduction of representatives would take place over a number of years due to natural attrition.
