Sunbury Chaplaincy update and request Nancy Prewer and I (Helen Hall) are still the 'Sunbury Chaplaincy Support Group' (no other members). We are no longer fundraising because the Sunbury schools are supporting themselves by bridging any gap after government funding. We do still keep in touch with our Chaplains, monitoring their roles and any changes. The schools with an active Chaplaincy role are: Sunbury West PS, Sunbury Heights PS, Kismet Park PS and Red Rock Christian College. Killara PS has also asked for a Chaplain but so far no applications have been received by Korus Connect (formerly Access Ministries) www.korusconnect.org.au. We recently received the following request from Richard Kolega (Korus NE Regional Manager) :

"I am sending out a prayer request for Killara PS which was successful in gaining NSWP funding for 2024-27 and is now seeking a Chaplain 1½ days per week. We have been advertising this role for several months now and have not had a single applicant. We would really like to see this new school have a Chaplain. As we are instructed in Matthew 9:37-38, please pray that a suitable applicant would be raised up to fill this role."

- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (not plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
