Sammy Stamp news from October UCAF Network magazine: A couple of Sammy's helpers journeyed to Kangaroo Flat UC (Bendigo) last year to speak at a UCAF Regional gathering. Their presentation included how a lot of sales are accomplished through the internet, including buyers from overseas. Sammy Stamp volunteers came home that day with many stamps to trim, sort and sell. Up to and including the 5th Sep 2024, sales had reached about \$22,330 (\$22,542 in the same period last year).

Extract from December Crosslight: In 1919, the PWMU (Presbyterian Women's Missionary Union) started a stamp collecting program to raise money for missional work. Taken on by the UC when it formed in 1977, the UCAF Stamp Fund (now called Sammy Stamp), has since chalked up \$1.2 million through the sale of stamps, with about \$1.15 million given to numerous projects. "The Sammy Stamp guidelines say that 'funds will be used for the relief of suffering, whether that suffering be physical, emotional, spiritual, or economic, or for the betterment of people who, in turn, will be able to influence the health and wellbeing of their immediate or extended community.'" convenor Allan Clark says. Among recent projects were aid to Zambia (\$4000), Frontier Services Bush Chaplains (\$5000), the Uniting Vic/Tas Winter Appeal (\$5000), and construction of a medical building in Solomon Islands (\$5000). Recycling Corner

Use the recycling trolley or boxes in photocopy room for:

- medication blisters
- x-ray transparencies
- milk bottle lids



- used biros, textas, highlighters, correction tape dispensers
- bread bag tags <u>plastic</u> only (no tea bag tags or ring pulls please)
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (and plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to new 7-Eleven on Sunbury Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
