Uniting World in Action On **Sunday 16th June** we will be holding a Café Church in the church hall to celebrate 'Uniting World in Action', outlining environmental concerns in our Pacific Basin. All are welcome.

Warm Winter Wednesdays is a new venture where we will open the Drop-in Centre during winter on Wednesdays from 11am to 2pm to serve a soup and sandwich lunch to those in need or who are homeless.



- old biros and textas
- medication blisters
- milk bottle tops



- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (not plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
