Lord, I desire that at all times, those who benefit by my daily work may not only be refreshed in body, but may also be drawn closer to your love and refreshed in all your goodness.



Use the recycling trolley in the foyer for the following:

- old biros and textas
- medication blisters
- milk bottle tops



- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (not plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
