Missing – did anyone take home a white tablecloth to wash? Please see Margaret Mitchell as soon as possible if you know of its whereabouts.


- Congratulations to Alana McLaren who is performing with the Victorian State Junior Ballet yesterday and today, at the Darebin Arts Centre, in 'The Nutcracker' ballet, Alana is 10 years old.
- Our annual Car Boot Sale & Craft Market will no longer be happening. The Village Green no longer being available means that car sites would be located on our land only. The resulting loss of revenue from the usual large number of car sites, as well as the market stall insurance for the remaining sites having doubled this year, means it is no longer financially viable to continue the event in this format. Our own stalls are still worth running but with a different 'draw card' in lieu of the usual '60+ cars'. Church Council will be discussing an alternative event.

The last Car Boot Sale & Craft Market held was in 2019 (pre-covid) which was the 16th annual event. The total amount raised (round figures) was \$73,280 (includes \$2,472 in 2008 when it hailed!!) Sincere thanks to all those who contributed and/or helped in any way over those 16 years!

Use the recycling trolley in the foyer for donations of the following:

- milk bottle tops
- bread bag tags
- bread bags
- tea bag tags
- old biros
- medication blisters (empty)
- old glasses (spectacles)

A great way to recycle plastics that don't belong in the recycle bin is with the REDcycle bin at Coles or Woolies www.redcycle.net.au.

Examples of some plastics that can be REDcycled are:

biscuit packets, pet food bags, cat litter bags, bubble wrap, ice cream wrappers, bread bags, AusPost and courier satchels, snap-lock bags, squeeze pouches (with lid), cereal box liners, cellophane, chocolate and snack bar wrappers, fresh produce bags, netting bags (for fruit), pasta/rice bags, document sleeves (with white strip removed).

... and MANY, MANY more!!

You can use a larger item above, like a pet food bag or toilet roll wrapper, to hold all the rest. If you'd like a full list, please ask me (Helen H) for a hard or emailed copy.
