World Day of Prayer This service will be held on Wednesday 6th March at 7.30pm at the Salvation Army (27 Anderson Road). All welcome. Enquiries to Gwen on 0412 547 643.



The theme this year is "I Beg You ... Bear With One Another in Love," based on Ephesians 4:1-7.

The program calls us to bear with each other in love, despite all difficulties and oppression. It was written by an ecumenical group of Palestinian Christian women. The Worship Service shares stories of three Palestinian Christian women, who witness to the power of bearing together in love. Their stories illuminate the experiences of Palestinian women from three different generations. The symbol of an

olive tree is used throughout the worship service. This represents the three generations through the trunk, branches, and leaves of the olive tree.

The World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical Christian laywomen's

initiative. It is run under the motto 'Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action' and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries in March. The movement aims to bring together women of various races, cultures and traditions in a yearly common Day of Prayer, as well as in closer fellowship, understanding and action throughout the year.
