Recycling update

• Bread bag tags – plastic only please, no cardboard.

• **Tea bag tags and ring pulls** – we currently have nowhere to send these so please don't bring them to church. If anyone has a craft use for them or knows anywhere to donate them, please let Nancy or Helen know.

• **10c containers** – please keep bringing those bottles, cans and small fruit boxes (there are leaflets on the recycling trolley showing eligible items).

• **Upparel** – Clothing, linen, and other textiles that are no longer fit for reuse are diverted from landfill by **UPPAREL** and transformed into a revolutionary material called UPtex. To date, over 10 million textiles items have been saved from entering landfills across Australia! Whilst some of these are reused via trusted charity partners, many are not fit for wear. That's where UPtex comes in.

Check out what can be donated on the website <u>https://upparel.com.au</u>. There is a cost involved in donating used textiles and unwearable clothes

(10 or 20kg boxes) but just think how you'll be helping the environment! Not only will you free up space in your home, but you'll also be joining the fight against the textile waste crisis. For every 1kg of textiles that avoids landfill, you'll prevent an



average 3-4kg of greenhouse gases from polluting the atmosphere.

Book a collection on the website, download the labels and affix. You can have the box collected from your house, or you can take it to the PO.

Editor's note: I recently donated 20 kg to Upparel – old curtains, clothes etc. I was very grateful for Upparel instead of all this going to landfill!

Recycling Corner

Use the recycling trolley in the foyer for the following:

- old biros and textas
- medication blisters

•

- milk bottle tops
- bread bag tags <u>plastic</u> only
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (not plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to 7-Eleven in Gap Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
