- **PWMU CookBook ...** The PWMU Cookbook is the oldest continuous cookbook in Australia, and has been in print since 1904. The 2024 edition celebrates 120 years of the book, with royalties funding the mission and ministry of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria and the Uniting Church in Victoria. If you're interested, you can <u>order here</u> (\$25 + \$12.20 postage). **Postage is cheaper if 2 or more are ordered**, so let me know soon if you'd like one and I will order in bulk (I have **4** copies ordered so far).
- Journey through the Ranges ... will take place on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> July from 9.45 am to 4.30 pm pick up and drop off at our church. The cost will be \$69. This is a social day out, not a fundraiser. We will visit:
  - Hanging Rock Winery and Farm \$10 wine tasting
  - Cleveland Estate Winery \$15 tasting and you can buy lunch
  - ➤ Gindu Distillery Woodend \$18 to \$23 tasting
  - or do your own thing in Woodend's interesting little shops

The cost of tastings is usually refunded if you buy from the shop. We need 13 confirmed bookings for this to go ahead. \$69 in cash can be given to Nancy Prewer or Jackie Cowan, or you can pay by direct deposit to St. Andrew's Fundraising Account BSB 633 000, Account number 115212300 – by Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> June please. Once the bus is booked no refunds can be given unless someone can be found to fill your spot. If 22 people book, the cost will be about \$59 and the difference will be refunded.

• Workshop with Rev. Dr. Sally Douglas ... UCA minister/theologian and academic, based on her book The Church as Salt . What would a church look like if it sought to be salt as Jesus spoke about in Matthew 5, rather than enticed by the need to be successful? This is a timely conversation to be had as we wrestle with what it means to be the church in our current context. You can obtain a copy of Sally's book either online from Coventry Press, from Koorong (currently on back order), Amazon, or borrow from a library, and read it in preparation for the workshop.
