Labour Day 10<sup>th</sup> March The first march for an 8-hour day by the labour movement occurred in Melbourne on the 21st April 1856. On this day, stonemasons and building workers on building sites around Melbourne stopped work and marched from the University of Melbourne to Parliament House to achieve an 8-hour day. Their direct action protest was a success, and they are noted as being among the first organised workers in the world to achieve an 8-hour day, with no loss of pay.

**Recycling requests (1)** If you're a Chemist Warehouse customer, could you please consider taking your used pill blisters with you when you go there for prescriptions? The box is in the corner next to the Prescriptions counter (in both shops). They mount up very quickly in our trolley and this will help me keep up with them! I usually have the whole bin-full to squeeze into these boxes! Note: CW is the <u>only</u> pharmacy chain that recycles pill blisters (2) Please remove <u>all packaging</u> from ink cartridges/toners when you leave them in the recycle boxes or trolley (if you don't, I have to). *Loose in a bag is perfectly ok instead of ink stains on your hands or clothing*!



# Use the recycling trolley or boxes in photocopy room for:

- medication blisters
- x-ray transparencies
- milk bottle lids
- used biros, textas, highlighters, correction tape dispensers
- bread bag tags <u>plastic</u> only (no tea bag tags *or* ring pulls please)
- old glasses (spectacles)
- CDs and DVDs (and plastic cases)
- all coffee/Slurpee cups, plastic straws and lids – or take to new 7-Eleven on Sunbury Road
- used postage stamps Joycelyn and Reg collect for Sammy Stamp
- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
