
10c containers – please keep bringing those bottles, cans and small fruit boxes (there are leaflets on the recycling trolley showing eligible items).

- toner/ink cartridges, batteries, small electrical devices
- mobile phones and chargers, to support Melbourne Zoo's 'Gorilla Doctors' program in East Africa
